 NCCllr S Aquarone report:

Mobile libraries saved: campaign to save the mobile library service from drastic cuts has succeeded. The County Council's proposals now have been radically changed to remove only 92 stops which are those not currently being used, rather than the proposed 725 - nearly half the library stops in the county. This is a huge victory for the 7,500 people who rely on this crucial service. Many thanks to the 494 people who signed our petition, as well as the 76 individuals who sent in letters. Now the service is protected we need to make sure it remains frequently used!

It was agreed to submit the same comments as for the previous application (see Minutes for September 2018) as the only change in the applications was the new evidence on wildlife habitation.

 - PU/18/1574: Church Farm Barn, Snoring Road: Prior approval for change of use from light industrial building (B1) to 5 residential dwellings (C3). Link circulated (also to email database). REFUSED.
 - iii) It was noted that the decision for the proposal at 91 The Street was still pending and that the decision date for the application at the Duck Farm had been put back to June 2019.

c) Other matters

- i) Fencing at old pub site. It was agreed that T Rivett would have a word with the owner.
- 8) To consider making **donations**.
 - a) It was resolved that the Council in accordance with its powers under sections 137 and 139 of the Local Government Act 1972, should incur the following expenditure which, in the opinion of the Council, is in the interests of the area or its inhabitants and will benefit them in a manner commensurate with the expenditure. It was agreed to make a donation of £200 to the Village Hall for use of the hall for meetings.

10) To consider and set the Budget and Precept for 2019-20

- a) It was agreed to accept the Local Council Tax Support Grant from NNDC of £92.
- b) The figures on the draft budget were reviewed (attached). The cost of the refurbishment of the village sign was considered (see below).
- c) To determine whether or not there are any other likely calls on planned expenditure. None.
- d) It was agreed to set the Precept for 2019-20 at £3,700 (an increase of £100 or 3%). The form for the District Council was completed and signed.

11) Maintenance

- a) **Village Sign** (£1,600 reserved in budget):
 - i) Signs of the Times: It was reported that the polyurethane copy not possible.
 - ii) Signs of the Times suggested the alternative was to refurbish the sign: dismantling the sign (remove falcon, shields and letters), sand blasted clean, galvanised, 'T' washed and

fettled, spray painted blue and white and the rest hand painted. Reassembled with original letters (or cast polymer copies) and shield detail fixed on with an adhesive and painted. As the old metal pieces will not be galvanised it might better to make polymer copy that doesn't corrode. £2,984.10 + VAT (carriage – can be returned via palletshifter).

The cost of the refurbishment was considered very expensive. The Clerk was asked to get further information from Signs of the Times e.g. how long would the refurbishment last, and to investigate alternatives e.g. new sign, other quotes for refurbishment.

- b) **Notice board:** Ivan Ashby to repair the wooden notice board and apply two coats of varnish: £121.20 (incl. VAT).

13) Reports from Parish Councillors

- a) The Clerk reported form the Fakenham Market Town meeting. The major focus would be on transport infrastructure for the town including ensuring that the new developments to the north of the town had proper pedestrian, cycling and car routes into town; rationalising the parking in the town centre, and also investigating proper cycle paths from the neighbouring villages e.g. along the A148 from Little Snoring.
- b) A couple of councillors suggested that the green lane (access of A1067 between Pensthorpe and Fakenham) could be used but would need to be extended to the Langor Bridge road to allow cyclists to avoid using the A1067.
