Climate: Care with Cars

We all know that using fuel such as petrol, diesel and aviation fuel adds greenhouse gases to the atmosphere. People in North Norfolk emit 200,000 tonnes of CO₂ each year to get around or have goods transported. So, transport is a big source of climate-changing greenhouse gases. Among the ten things that the WWF lists that we could be doing to reduce our emissions is to 'travel responsibly'. But what does this mean?

We all have to get around but there are some more responsible ways to travel. We don't have so many travel choices here in the countryside: it would be great to have more buses, cycle lanes, footpaths, etc. But we who drive cars can make simple savings by driving fuel-efficiently, sharing journeys and avoiding unnecessary ones, keeping our car well-maintained and not using the air con. A smaller car or an electric one might reduce the overall carbon budget. The table shows a few modes of transport and their emissions.

Mode of Transport	Grams CO ₂ equivalent /km per passenger
Average petrol car – 1 occupant	246
Average petrol car – 3 occupants	62
Average local bus/coach – fully loaded	13
Average train – fully loaded	24
Walking or cycling	0

Our County Council wants people in Norfolk not to use their cars for just one day in support of a global initiative to reduce carbon emissions, to encourage people to be less dependent on their cars and try alternatives. Norfolk Car-Free Day is Sunday 19 September. We might not want to, or be able to, forsake our cars on that day but we might think about how we use our cars and what alternatives we could find – on any day of the week!



David will give an illustrated talk on Seahenge, the neighbouring second circle, and the dating of both to 2049 BC. He will explore how they might have been used and their significance to the study of timber circles in the British Isles.
- Saturday 16 October – Alex and Christina, who entertained up last September in the Church Field, are coming. As we were unable to open the Hall as originally planned Alex and Christina, who were originally booked to celebrate, will be playing for us.

Four Winds Four Artists

From David Head: I've been associated with Kettlestone for the last twenty-plus years, and living here for the last two, but I grew up on what is now the ultra-expensive north coast, at Burnham Overy Staithe. My grandmother moved to the family house in 1929, which is now being sold by my brothers and their children. My mother was an avid artist (for some while she illustrated the packaging for Norfolk Lavender), my father too. My godmother, who lived in half the house after the war, also painted, as do I.

The Handa Gallery, in Wells Maltings (Staithe Street, Wells-next-the-Sea), **are hosting an exhibition called Four Winds Four Artists**, including paintings by the four of us, and also some which were in the house by local painters from the 1930s to the 1960s - so, some local history.
