NOT-SO-WILD RESOLUTIONS FOR WILDLIFE

Happy 2023! A new year, and traditionally a time for resolutions. But what might they be?

Wildlife had another tough year in 2022. Recently, the National Trust's annual audit described the devastating effects of last year's chaotic weather (extremes of temperature, droughts and floods, wildfires and storms) on UK wildlife:

'The extreme conditions have made survival very difficult for animals, from toads and bats to birds and butterflies, and from great trees to meadowland flowers.'

A local example of this devastation is the Sandwich



Terns at Blakeney. They had a really bad year, with only one pair nesting, compared with more than 3,000 the previous year.

In our gardens, we could resolve to: 'say no to the mow'; plant insect-friendly wild flowers; introduce some new habitats; or keep our cats in at night and exercise special control during

the bird-nesting season.

For those with time and energy to spare, there are many opportunities for volunteering, donating, and supporting local nature-friendly organisations.

- With the Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) one can get involved with local practical conservation efforts, for example at Brett's Wood, Thursford Wood, and Holt Lowes. Donations are always welcome, too. Last year, the NWT successfully raised £600,000 to create a new nature reserve for Norwich at Sweet Briar Marshes.
- If volunteering for one-off events is more convenient, why not take part in **Norfolk Beach Cleans**? They also give advice and loan equipment if you want to conduct a beach clean of your own.

- If your passion is for rivers, donate to, or support in other ways, the Norfolk Rivers Trust. Contact them to find volunteering opportunities.
- Donations and support are also welcomed by Norfolk Trails. Volunteers are needed for the Coast Path, the ancient Peddars Way, and for numerous circular walks.
- And closest to home is **Pensthorpe**. Most of their volunteers work for a day a week but some activities only take a few hours. Volunteers receive induction and training.



And, of course, resolving to write to our MP, District and County Councillors or sign online petitions about environmental issues affecting wildlife is another way to help to improve conditions for all our wonderful plants and animal.

You'll no doubt have your own resolutions to make: best wishes for carrying them out in 2023.
