New bus shelter for Pensthorpe

Have you noticed the very attractive new bus shelter at Pensthorpe? This was a project conceived and led by the Parish Council, with funding shared between Pensthorpe Natural Park and a grant from the Parish Partnership scheme funded by Norfolk County Council.



In keeping with the ethos of Pensthorpe a wooden shelter was chosen. The shelter is not only useful for visitors to Pensthorpe, but also for Pensthorpe children waiting for a school bus and for residents. In addition, a new trod footway has been installed on the opposite side of the road, giving a route for residents to the bus

shelters. The project was managed by Robert Kilbourn, who acted as the main liaison between Pensthorpe Park, the Parish Council and all the other organisations involved. As you can imagine, for a structure to be installed close to the highway there were many rules to comply with, including the requirement for traffic management when the shelter was delivered. Robert handled all of these details and also constructed the base of the shelter and the trod, all of which took many, many hours. Very many thanks to Robert, Pensthorpe for staff help and funding, and Norfolk County Council for the grant.

BBC Radio Norfolk Treasure Quest

It was a great surprise to receive an email from Paul Hayes, the producer of *Treasure Quest* on BBC Radio Norfolk, asking to feature Kettlestone as one of the locations in the programme on Sunday 5 February. We had to agree to keep the information to ourselves, so sadly we couldn't let anyone else know.

Volunteering – we need you!

There are many people in the village who give up their time to volunteer, either for village organisations, charities based in the village, or for other organisations.

The village would not be the friendly, welcoming place it is without people working hard behind the scenes to provide social activities, maintain the church, churchyard and service schedule, managing the almshouses, as well as many other activities. All our volunteers deserve a big vote of thanks and an acknowledgment that keeping everyone happy is a near impossible task! In the February newsletter we learned that Erica will be stepping down as Chair of the village hall committee at the AGM. I would like to thank her for her hard work on the committee and wish her a nice rest!

Parish Councils are part of the formal structure of local government, working at grass roots level and providing communities with a democratic voice and a structure for taking community action. Parish Councils have only a limited range of powers in a small parish such as ours, but are consultees on local planning applications. All councillors are volunteers, and only the clerk is paid. Parish Councillors are elected every 4 years, and the next election will be on 4 May. We will have some councillors standing down this year and it is really important that we have a functional (quorate) council. The work is not onerous (except in the rare event of a major or controversial planning application), and there are usually only 6 meetings in a year.

Candidate nomination forms need to be submitted between 21 March and 4 April. If you would like further information or help, please speak to any councillor or the Clerk, Joanna. For information see

Photo ID for Voting

The government has introduced a requirement for voters to show **photo ID** when voting at a polling station from 4 May. Individuals who don't have an accepted photo ID can apply for a free voter ID document (Voter Authority Certificate).
